Introduction:

- A. Would it be safe to say that America has seen profound changes in culture & morality over the last five decades?
 - 1. Humanism, atheism, evolution, liberalism, pluralism, and political correctness are aggressively attacking Christianity & Christian principles at every opportunity.
 - 2. Some have said that a "culture of death" is permeating our country.
 - 3. Aspects of might be characterized as:
 - a. Materialism; consumerism; secularism; relativism; and hyperindividualism
 - b. These things take on very different forms in our day & age and disguise themselves very well.
- B. In describing late 20th century America, author Tom Wolfe has surmised:
 - 1. The democratic elements of our nation are fading
 - 2. We are immersed in wealth and enjoy the freedom of social mobility like never before.
 - 3. Personal liberty is greater than ever...in fact many now equate liberty with license!
 - a. Manners are relaxed; behavior formerly frowned upon is now tolerated, marriage is easily terminated.
 - b. Games and spectacles abound.
 - 4. Fabric of customs that once helped to civilize relations between men/women is frayed...
 - a. Fatherhood/motherhood receives little support/respect
 - b. Children spend more time w/TV; Internet; video games than w/parents.
- C. People are now openly hostile toward God. From Hollywood, academic elites, to common person.
 - 1. We live in perilous times. May get worse.
 - 2. Laws & history are being rewritten.
 - 3. May someday get to point where the practice of Christianity will be viewed as insensitive, hateful, and against some of the laws of society.
- D. Psalm 33:12, 18
 - 1. As a nation...do we fear God?
 - 2. Yes. We do hope for His loving-kindness...in word. But as a nation...do we continue to seek Him *in deed*?
 - 3. Broadly speaking, I feel that we have become a nation that has forgotten God.
 - 4. And...as we shall see, we do so at our own peril.
- E. In our lesson today we shall:
 - 1. Look at Israel of old
 - 2. Compare their rise & fall to today.

3. Continue our thoughts into this evening's lesson.

I. A look at Israel

- A. Under David, Israel had strong relationship with God.
 - 1. Started with the character of their leader 2 Sam. 5:12.
 - 2. 2 Sam. 5:19 God was factored into decisions
 - 3. 2 Sam. 5:25a God's expectations were followed closely
 - 4. God was exalted, reverenced, and recognized.
- B. 2 Sam. 7:18-22 David's prayer characterizes what would be a prevailing national attitude.
 - 1. Result? 2 Sam. 8:14b-15 Israel greatly blessed. Triumphs over enemies.
 - 2. David rules over *all* of Israel.
 - a. Subdued enemies that had plagued them for centuries.
 - b. Territory @ largest point it had ever been conquering nations/people that should have been taken upon Israel's entering the land.
 - c. Israel's power/influence recognized internationally.
 - 3. Yes David had his failures:
 - a. 2 Sam. 6 Uzzah and the ark
 - b. 2 Sam. 11 Bathsheba
 - c. 2 Sam. 13-14 family discord Absalom; Amnon; Tamar
 - d. 2 Sam. 24 an unlawful census taken
 - 4. But yet...David recognized his mistakes. Look at some of his final words: 2 Sam. 22:2-3a; 50-51
- C. After his death, slow gradual descent begins leading Israel away from God and ultimately toward its destruction.
 - 1. 1 Kings 11:1-6 starts in old age of Solomon. Turns to idols.
 - a. Son Rehoboam consults, not with God, but with peers on higher taxation leaders to division of country. 10 tribes in N; 2 tribes in S.
 - 2. 1 Kings 12:25-30 Jeroboam's first act.
 - 3. The downward progression builds steam: Ahab 1 Kings 16:29-33
 - a. Think that influence of national leader doesn't matter? Due to Ahab's leadership/encouragement Baal worship spreads.
 - b. Devotees to Baal completely permeated the nation 2 Kings 10:18-24a.
 - c. Jehu kills these followers 10:25
 - d. 10:26-28
 - e. 10:29, 31 but yet Jehu's devotion to God was only partial.
 - 4. And from here it only gets worse.
- D. 2 Kings 17:6 northern tribes destroyed.
 - 1. Note carefully the explanation why 17:7-23

II. A striking parallel

- A. Ours is a nation that for its first 175 years openly recognized God.
- B. This is not what our young people are being told. Today they hear:

- 1. Founding fathers endorsed pluralism. Deists not Christians.
- 2. Opposed public expression of Christian religion in connection with government.
- 3. Lies...all lies. These lies have been repeated over and over and are now accepted as fact.
 - a. Easier to believe a lie that has been heard 1000 times than to believe a fact no one has heard before.
 - b. Hitler said the bigger the lie; the easier it is to deceive the masses.
- 4. Separation of Church & State.
 - a. Term not found in constitution.
 - b. Comes from private correspondence of Thomas Jefferson.
 - i. In context...used to alleviate concerns of a Baptist association that was concerned about the government interfering with the free/open practice of religion.
 - ii. Jefferson said the government couldn't do that. His words were written to express that the government should keep itself from interfering with the free exercise of the Christian religion.
 - iii. That is not what is happening today.
- C. God is everywhere in the founding documents of our country. His influence and recognition by people is clearly seen in American culture until the 1950's.
 - 1. Declaration of Independence: God is identified as:
 - a. Supreme Judge of the World
 - b. Creator
 - c. Divine Providence
 - 2. George Washington's 1789 Thanksgiving declaration:
 - a. It is the duty of all nations to acknowledge the One True God.
 - b. Imagine an American President doing this today.
 - c. Entire document is essentially a sermon & a testimony to God.
 - 3. Pledge of Allegiance...one nation under God.
 - a. Not in original in 1892
 - b. Added in 1954 by Congress...required pledge to be recited by Americans around the country.
 - c. Supreme court has dealt with this recently...passed on it...but it will come up again. What happens when we have more liberal judges?
 - 4. Every President in his inaugural address has referred to the God of the Bible in his inaugural address...Washington to Bush.
 - a. Washington/Bush statements
 - b. Will it happen this week?
- D. These are but a few examples. God is everywhere in our nation. The Christian influence built the moral foundation of our country.
 - 1. Government documents
 - 2. Coinage
 - 3. National symbols
 - 4. Presidential oath
 - 5. National songs/hymns
 - 6. Cemeteries

- E. Radical & powerful forces now seek to remove God from everything and everywhere.
 - 1. They have already succeeded in ways that would have been unfathomable twenty years ago.
 - a. See supplement.
 - **b.** As we cut God out of our lives...so He will cut us out of His plans.
 - 2. In popular culture, Christianity is framed from the viewpoint of its adherents as nothing more than religious "nuts" or "old fashioned" or "out of touch"
 - 3. Look at network television; cable television...books; Internet; music...all forms/types of media.
- F. Newt Gingrich: There is no attack on American culture more deadly and more historically dishonest than the secular effort to drive God out of America's public life.
- G. Proverbs 14:34
 - 1. Where are we headed? Certainly ... as a nation ... we are headed away from God.
 - 2. God will not allow that to go unnoticed/unpunished.

Conclusion:

- A. Don't fall into the trap that all is well & we'll be OK.
 - 1. History says that will not be the case.
 - 2. More importantly, God's word says that will not be the case.

 - 1. 2 Chronicles 7:14-15
 - 2. A warning: 2 Chronicles 7:19-22
 - 3. Brethren: Our national sins cry out to God for justice
